

INTRODUCTION:


THERE ARE MANY WAYS TO BIND A BOOK, BUT JAPANESE 4-HOLE BINDING IS A GOOD PLACE TO START, AS IT REQUIRES FEWER MATERIALS THAN GLUE BINDINGS AND HAS ENDLESS VARIATIONS. IN THIS ZINE, YOU'LL GET AN INTRODUCTION TO THE BASIC 4-HOLE STITCH AND SUGGESTIONS FOR OTHER BOOK-ADVENTURES - enjoy!

MHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- · PAPER
- · A RULER (METAL + CORK - BACKED
- IS BEST)
- · AN X-ACTO KNIFE
- · SCISSORS
- A BINDER'S NEEDLE (OR LARGE EMBROIDERY NEEDLE)
- · AN AWL

- BINDER'S THREAD (OR A LENGTH OF EMBROIDERY THREAD SPLIT IN HALF)
 - · LARGE BINDER CLIPS
 - · BEESWAX (FOR WAXING THE THREAD)
 - · A BONE FOLDER*
 - LOOKS A BIT LIKE THIS!

* USED TO SCORE PAPER SOIT FOLDS MORE EASILY



GETTING STARTED. CHOOSE THE SIZE OF YOUR BOOK!

MININ BE ANY SIZE SHAPE, BUT KEEP THE MEASURING MARKING SINCE THE BOOK IS MADE FROM A STACK OF SINGLE PAGES, YOU CAN HAVE AS MANY DIFFERENT PATTERNS, EXTURES, COLOURS, ETC. THRILLS!

STITCH PATH-RKING MIN. 18" FROM THE SPINE (INSIDE OF MARKIN FRONT COVER MIN. 3" FROM HEAD AND TAIL OF BOOK THE OTHER TWO SEWING STATIONS (2+3) SHOULD BE AN EQUAL DISTANCE BETWEEN TOP THE AND BOTTOM MARKS (1+4)


CLET READY WITH YOUR MARKS MADE, ALIGN THE BOOK BLOCK PERFECTLY ON ALL 4 SIDES AND CLAMP IT FIRMLY WITH BINDER CLIPS (AS SHOWN) USING YOUR AWLY CAREFULLY PUNCH HOLES AT THE FINALLY, UNCLAMP MARKED SPOTS . YOUR BOOK, FLIP COVER!

> +STRAIGHTEN BOOK BLOCK. THEN RE-CLAMP.

TO BEGIN, CUT A LENGTH OF THREAD
THAT'S 4x THE HEIGHT OF YOUR
BOOK (1 DO THIS BY WRAPPING THE
THREAD 4x AROUND MY BOOK BLOCK).

WAX YOUR THREAD SO IT GOES THROUGH THE AWL-HOLES MORE EASILY — HOLD IT FIRMLY AGAINST THE CHUNK OF BEESWAX AND PULL THE THREAD ACROSS SLOWLY.





ONCE YOU'VE GOT THE BASICS, TRY PLAYING WITH FOLDOUTS AND WEIRD PAPER SIZES!


TIP: WHEN BINDING, PUT FOLDOUT IN DESIRED SPOT + LEAVE IT FOLDED OUT WHEN STITCHING.



MEASURING & FOLDOUT:




YOU CAN BIND ALL SORTS OF PAGE SIZES AS LONG AS THEY LINE UP WITH AN
